### ***The Redemptorists***

The Redemptorists and their collaborators have been the guardians of the Shrine since 1878.

Priests are available daily for confession, pastoral guidance, and the blessing of religious articles.

### ***Audioguide***

Since 1947, the Aides of Saint Anne have voluntarily offered a service for pilgrims with special needs. You may borrow a wheelchair from them.

Located across the street from the Basilica, the Basilica Inn offers accommodations and restaurant service. (*wheelchair access*)

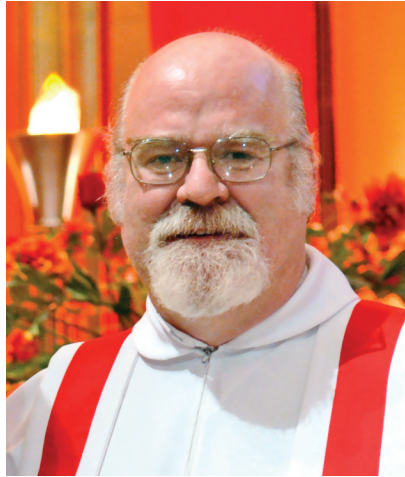
### ***Domain Saint Anne***

*Father Paul Bombardier was born in Holyoke, MA, in 1953. From 1977 to 1982, he studied theology at the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium. He was ordained a priest in 1982 and was appointed to the Springfield-in-Massachusetts diocese.*

*Over the years, he has served in eight different parishes, and is currently pastor at St. Joseph Parish in Shelburne Falls, MA.*

*Fr. Paul, who is a talented musician and fiber artist, is no stranger to the Saint Anne family. He has been travelling to the Shrine with the Ahearn Memorial Pilgrimage since 1990, served at the Shrine for three months during the summer of 1999, and preached the English Novena in 2001.*
